Standing Orders for Annual General Meeting

- The proposer of the motion or an amendment thereto, may speak for five minutes but no longer.
- A person speaking to a motion or amendment shall not exceed three minutes.
- The proposer of a motion or amendment may speak a second time for five minutes before a vote is taken, but no other person may speak a second time to any motion or amendment.
- The Chairman shall, at any time he considers that a matter has been sufficiently discussed, call on a proposer to reply, after which a vote must be taken.
- A person may, with the consent of the Chairman, move 'that the question now be put after which, when the proposer has spoken a vote must be taken.

Significant challenges during the year:

Na Fianna fully supported the new minor structure in Dublin Camogie introduced in 2022. It was recognised this would have a knock on effect on our adult teams, including Junior for the two years it would take for minor players to feed through to adult.

We managed to field two junior teams in 2022, however, with several players sitting Leaving Cert in 2023 and several others catching up on long delayed travel plans the decision was made to enter only one junior team for both league and championship 2023. This team has been graded at Junior 3 which marks a significant step up for our remaining Junior 5 squad players. League match results didn't reflect the work rate put in by the team. Thanks to the commitment of a core group of players over the summer as well as support from our third minor team at time of writing the team are looking forward to kicking off their 2023 championship campaign.



Highlights of the year to date:

Very high player retention levels, a couple of new additions this year, and 4 boys returning to play hurling with the Div 7 squad has been a highlight. This means we can comfortably continue to line out 3 x U16 hurling teams (the only club in Dublin to do so, with most clubs struggling to field 1 or 2 teams). Individually by team:



- Our Div 1 squad finished in mid-table place with 4 wins in a competitive league, while providing platform for 4 squad players to be represented on Dublin squads, and developing players rotating from the B team in support.
- o The Div 4 team lived up its "Killer-B's" nickname (provided by Donal Ryan GPO), as the strongest B team in Dublin hurling over the last two years, with players rotating into Div 1 & from Div 7. A 3rd place league finish was accomplished in 2023.
- The Div 7 team competing well against B teams from other clubs and single-club teams to finish 3rd. The team has competed strongly even with Dub Dev Squad players in some games & many clubs dropping down higher division players as standard all providing good challenges & development opportunity to the boys.

Weekend in June 2023 – Football & Hurling A Teams went to Carlingford for a day of activities and an overnight stay. Same weekend, the B, C and D teams went to Monaghan (Tanagh Centre) for a day of activities and an overnight stay.

Lastly, our group would like to thank the 2008 group for their support this season, on those limited occasions where our player coverage was impacted. This support was also provided from our group into the current Minor hurling setup.

Significant challenges during the year:

A huge thank you to everyone who continues to provide support across the Adult and Juvenile codes including the Games Chairs, Game co-ordinators and to all mentors who have been so proactive in maintaining their respective Squad Lists and ensuring prompt payment of subscriptions.

As can be seen from the table above, whilst numbers are up slightly overall, this is predominantly driven by the continued strong growth in our nursery and juvenile members. Adult playing numbers have rebounded somewhat from 2022 numbers, with the modest growth driven particularly by the increase in Female Adult Players (+14).

Significant challenges:

The numbers above show a steady decline in Adult Non-Playing members, this is particularly evident within the Nursery and Juvenile section. Whilst numbers are buoyant in terms of the influx of children joining the club, what is noticeable, is that their parents are not joining in sufficient numbers. A steady stream of non-playing members is vital to ensure the club has sufficient volunteers mentoring, serving on working groups, marking out pitches etc.

On the playing side, it is **essential** that all players and mentors have paid up. Players not paid up **are not** registered with their respective associations and **are not** insured. Non-registered players should not be taking part in training or playing matches until membership fees are paid. No pay, no play remains the key message for all mentors.

The respective associations are all running regular audits of submitted team sheets, including both mentors and players, to ensure all named individuals are registered and have the appropriate clearances



and vetting. Failure to comply with the directives will result in disciplinary sanctions on the club, so it is vital that everyone plays their part in ensuring we remain compliant.

Key objectives for next year:

We continue to liaise closely with the ClubZap team and other GAA clubs, as they improve and develop the membership system. Mentors can now see who is paid and/or registered so we encourage and promote the usage of the weekly Squad Reports for team administration.

Integration between the ClubZap and Foireann registration systems is showing steady improvement and we're hoping to see further streamlining in the coming year which will ultimately help reduce the administrative overhead, particularly the overhead associated with managing separate association memberships across GAA, LGFA and the Camogie Boards.

Key Activities for the year: The morning of Sunday 4th of June saw the arrival at Mobhí Road of 260 under-10 footballers forming nineteen teams to play in Na Fianna's annual U10 Football Blitz representing eight different clubs from six counties across Ulster and Leinster, spanning from Dungannon in Tyrone to Blackwater in Wexford.



The throwing-in of the first ball at 11:00 was the culmination of three months of work, starting with initial approaches to teams from March onwards, thousands of messages, dozens of meetings and an eruption of cooperation from the entire 2013 boys group. Many thanks are due to those involved in previous years' events for their advice, which was gratefully taken on board.

Games were scheduled in three divisions, with a total of 51 matches played across 9 pitches over the course of four hours, with staggered break for lunch for every team. A very generous sponsor emerged from the group in the form of Fitzsimons Temple Bar, who not only paid for but also sourced and transported all the supplies for our barbecue and much else besides. With the contribution of snacks and sandwiches from parents, we succeeded in our aim of providing both hot and cold catering free of charge to all players, mentors and parents. The small amount of excess was donated to a local food bank; a testament to the catering group's organisation. Goalposts were transported from other sites in preparation for the games and were returned immediately after the event and the entire Mobhí Road site was cleaned both before and after the event. To cater for the large number of cars and buses arriving a parking plan was put in place and executed flawlessly by those manning the gates. Every player went home with a medal, we had no major injuries that couldn't be handled by our on-site medic and despite the sometimes furious level of competition on the field, the standard of behaviour from both juvenile players and the adults lived up to what was demanded (somewhat bluntly) of all participants in advance, helped in no small way by the calming authority of the juvenile referee team. The messages of thanks received from travelling clubs in the hours and days following were reassurance that the sense of relief and achievement amongst the 2013 boys' group was well justified.

Recommendation

Recommendation No. 1

That every playing squad – of all ages and grades – are given the opportunity to play at least one county board fixture on the front pitch at Mobhi Road in each calendar year. – **Ciarán Rehill**

Recommendation No. 2

I wish to recommend a review of current CLG Na Fianna Bar Facilities and services.

Firstly, I wish to take this opportunity to commend Downey in her role as treasurer who has gone above and beyond to ensure the club bar has remained open for the last year. Without her efforts I strongly believe that the clubs bar facilities would cease to exist in CLG Na Fianna.

- Essential maintenance and repair works carried out in Patsys Bar and Mobhi Suite, and other areas of clubhouse
- The lift has been out of service since the beginning of the year leaving members with mobility difficulties from accessing club bar and functions
- Current function and ideology for bar facilities needs to be addressed. Is the purpose of bar facilities to provide maximum profit for the club or is the aim of the bar to be a social outlet for club members? The decision for a tier 2 pricing of goods at a members only event with also no option to avail of membership discount by using membership card is difficult to comprehend. Was this discussed and agreed at executive level and how was it deemed that this would encourage people to continue to avail of club bar facilities?
- Review of current hours, and letting members know what they are.
- Food in Clubhouse

I feel these factors are some of the reasons why there is not a regular number of people utilising the clubs bar facilities. Members want to use club bar in order to support the club and also enjoy the community element it has the potential to offer but it has proven difficult to remain loyal to the service over the past while. The element of GAA's community spirit and the use of bar facilities to unite members especially older members appears to be lost. I strongly feel this needs to be addressed to encourage people to come to Na Fianna and be part of the social aspect of club life.

I am aware there is currently no bar manager appointed at present, a review of what is being offered as a position and updated to ensure that someone is appointed asap. — **Andy Flaherty**

Recommendation No. 3

The Na Fianna Executive Committee, on behalf of club members, will direct the club delegates, to both the Dublin Camogie and the Dublin Ladies Football Association County Boards, to submit the following recommendation to the 2023 AGMs of both those boards:



"The Executive Committee, or any other such committee as appropriate, shall coordinate with their counterparts in Dublin Camogie/Dublin Ladies Football to devise and agree a master schedule for 2024 to provide for week on/week off fixtures for U18 league and championship and there after for adult league and championships."
